# THE APPLICATION OF CONTRACT PRICE ADJUSTMENT (CPA) TO TENDER SUBMISSIONS

#### 1 APPLICATION OF CPA

Eskom requires tenderers to submit offers that are in full accordance with the Project Sourcing CPA principles as contained below.

Eskom will afford Tenderers an opportunity to propose additional/alternate offers to the abovementioned. Additional Offers, which are optional, will only be considered if a fully compliant Main Offer is submitted and acceptable.

CPA conditions may apply if the contractual duration is to be longer than 12 months. If the contractual duration will be less than or equal to 12 months, a fixed and firm priced offer must be submitted.

CPA will kick in after sixteen (16) months from the base date unless a fixed and firm price offer is submitted.

The following principles apply to CPA:

- In-house indices provided by the supplier are not acceptable.
- Exchange rate adjustments cannot be part of any CPA formula.

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#### **Supplier Performance Review Clause on contracts -**

Annex J

Eskom will inform the contractor/supplier about the specific performance indicators that will be included in the performance management system as applicable to the contractor/supplier.

The performance schedule or agreeing to participate in the performance management system shall not diminish the obligations, duties or accountabilities of the contractor/supplier in terms of the contract or other rights of the Employer."

**Appendix - TPD Contractor Evaluation Tool Rev 16\_excel** identifies the minimum threshold that must be achieved and maintained. Failure to achieve and maintain a minimum score as stipulated in the tool, Eskom reserves its rights to refer the contractor/supplier to place an embargo/moratorium on the contractor/supplier to receive further contracts with Eskom.



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
