The City of Tshwane reserves the right to conduct a market analysis. Further action on failures by the supplier to deliver will be handled in terms of the contract, including performance warnings, and listing on the database of restricted suppliers.

The City further reserves the right to negotiate a market-related price with a tenderer scoring the highest points. If the tenderer does not agree to a market-related price, the City reserves the right to negotiate a market-related price with the tenderer scoring the second-highest points. If the tenderer scoring the second-highest points does not agree to a market-related price, the City reserves the right to negotiate a market-related price with the tenderer scoring the third-highest points. If a market-related price is not agreed upon, the City reserves the right to cancel the tender.
