TERMS OF REFERENCE (TORs) FOR PROCUREMENT OF BRANDING, MARKETING AND BRANDED PROMOTIONAL MATERIAL FOR KZN CONVENTION BUREAU

1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The KwaZulu-Natal Tourism Authority, which operates under the name Tourism KwaZulu-Natal, is responsible for the development, promotion, and marketing of tourism into and within the province. The Authority's statement of intent and direction is drawn from the mandate vested in the organization by the KwaZulu-Natal Tourism Act, 1996 (as amended, including No. 2 of 2002). The vision of Tourism KwaZulu-Natal is to position the province of KwaZulu-Natal as Africa's leading tourism destination, nationally and internationally.
- 1.2 Tourism KwaZulu-Natal have various departments within it, Convention Bureau department's role is to promote and market the province's many business events facilities, capabilities, and assets, both nationally and internationally by transforming KwaZulu-Natal into South Africa's premier meetings, incentives, conventions and exhibitions destination. The strategic objectives of the unit are to increase the number of business events hosted in the province of KwaZulu-Natal, provide financial and in-kind support in securing of business events and ensure success of the secured events and to drive transformation in the business events sector in the province of KwaZulu-Natal.
- 1.3 For a successful promotion of the province as the destination of choice to host big business events it is imperative to package the information and have promotional material that speaks to the work previously done and what support the convention bureau offer for the hosting of business events in the province.

3.1. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

3.1.1 THE 80/20 OR 90/10 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS

A maximum of 80 or 90 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—
 - (a) an invitation for tender for income-generating contracts, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the highest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system; or
 - (b) any other invitation for tender, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system,
