- 4.2 All returnable documents tabled in the Proposal Form [Section 5] must be returned with proposals.
- 4.3 Unless otherwise expressly stated, all Proposals furnished pursuant to this RFP shall be deemed to be offers. Any exceptions to this statement must be clearly and specifically indicated.

5 JOINT VENTURES OR CONSORTIUMS

Respondents who would wish to respond to this RFP as a Joint Venture [**JV**] or consortium with B-BBEE entities, must state their intention to do so in their RFP submission. Such Respondents must also submit a signed JV or consortium agreement between the parties clearly stating the percentage [%] split of business and the associated responsibilities of each party. 5. COMMUNICATION

- 5.3 Respondents are to note that changes to its submission will not be considered after the closing date.
- 5.4 It is prohibited for Respondents to attempt, either directly or indirectly, to canvass any officer or employee of Transnet in respect of this RFP between the closing date and the date of the award of the business.
- 5.5 Respondents found to be in collusion with one another will be automatically disqualified and restricted from doing business with organs of state for a specified period.
- 5.6 Transnet will publish the outcome of this RFP in the National Treasury e-tender portal and Transnet website with 10 days after the award has been finalised. Respondents are required to check the National Treasury e-tender Portal and Transnet website for the results of the tender process. All unsuccessful bidders have a right to request Transnet to furnish individual reasons for their bid not being successful. 6 CONFIDENTIALITY

All information related to this RFP is to be treated with strict confidence. In this regard Respondents are required to certify that they have acquainted themselves with the Non-Disclosure Agreement. All information related to a subsequent contract, both during and after completion thereof, will be treated with strict confidence. Should the need however arise to divulge any information related to this RFP or the subsequent contract, written approval must be obtained from Transnet.

7 COMPLIANCE

The successful Respondent [hereinafter referred to as the **Service provider** shall be in full and complete compliance with any and all applicable laws and regulations.

8 EMPLOYMENT EQUITY ACT

Respondents must comply with the requirements of the Employment Equity Act 55 of 1998 applicable to it including (but not limited to) Section 53 of the Employment Equity Act.

9 DISCLAIMERS

Respondents are hereby advised that Transnet is not committed to any course of action as a result of its issuance of this RFP and/or its receipt of Proposals. In particular, please note that Transnet reserves the right to:

- 9.1 modify the RFP's Goods/Services and request Respondents to re-bid on any such changes;
- 9.2 reject any Proposal which does not conform to instructions and specifications which are detailed herein;
- 9.3 disqualify Proposals submitted after the stated submission deadline [closing date];
- 9.4 award a contract in connection with this Proposal at any time after the RFP's closing date;
- 9.5 award a contract for only a portion of the proposed Goods/Services which are reflected in the scope of this RFP;
- 9.6 split the award of the contract between more than one Supplier/Service provider, should it at Transnet's discretion be more advantageous in terms of, amongst others, cost or developmental considerations;
- 9.7 cancel the bid process;
- 9.8 validate any information submitted by Respondents in response to this bid. This would include, but is not limited to, requesting the Respondents to provide supporting evidence. By submitting a bid, Respondents hereby irrevocably grant the necessary consent to Transnet to do so;

- 9.12 to award the business to the next ranked bidder, provided that he/she is still prepared to provide the required Goods at the quoted price, should the preferred bidder fail to sign or commence with the contract within a reasonable period after being requested to do so. Under such circumstances, the validity of the bids of the next ranked bidder(s) will be deemed to remain valid, irrespective of whether the outcome of the tender has been published the outcome of the bid process on the National Treasury e-tender Portal and Transnet website. Bidders may therefore be requested to advise whether they would still be prepared to provide the required Goods at their quoted price.

10 LEGAL REVIEW

A Proposal submitted by a Respondent will be subjected to review and acceptance or rejection of its proposed contractual terms and conditions by Transnet's Legal Counsel, prior to consideration for an award of business. A material deviation from the Standard terms or conditions could result in disqualification.

11 SECURITY CLEARANCE

Acceptance of this bid could be subject to the condition that the Successful Respondent, its personnel providing the Goods/Services and its subcontractor(s) must obtain security clearance from the appropriate authorities to the level of **CONFIDENTIAL/ SECRET/TOP SECRET**. Obtaining the required clearance is the responsibility of the Successful Respondent. Acceptance of the bid is also subject to the condition that the Successful Respondent will implement all such security measures as the safe performance of the contract may require.

12 NATIONAL TREASURY'S CENTRAL SUPPLIER DATABASE

Respondents are required to self-register on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD) which has been established to centrally administer supplier information for all organs of state and facilitate the verification of certain key supplier information. Respondents must register on the CSD prior to submitting their bids. Business may not be awarded to a Respondent who has failed to register on the CSD. Only foreign suppliers with no local registered entity need not register on the CSD.

For this purpose, the attached SBD 1 form must be completed and submitted as a mandatory returnable document by the closing date and time of the bid.

13 TAX COMPLIANCE

Respondents must be compliant when submitting a proposal to Transnet and remain compliant for the entire contract term with all applicable tax legislation, including but not limited to the Income Tax Act, 1962 (Act No. 58 of 1962) and Value Added Tax Act, 1991 (Act No. 89 of 1991).

SECTION 3:

BACKGROUND, OVERVIEW AND SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

1 BACKGROUND

Transnet has a mandate to put in place robust selection methods in order to "identify, hire, promote and proactively develop the best talent to deliver on the Transnet vision and strategy". The following are critical principles to be considered when making selection decisions:

- Hire and promote the best and right talent that meet the required education, experience, knowledge, skills, competencies, and abilities required for the role.
- Hire and promote objectively and fairly by applying objective and fair screening and selection methods.
- Hire and promote for role and organisational alignment by determining candidates motivational and values fit.
- Be just and equitable by ensuring that people management decisions relating to amongst others, hiring, promotion and development decisions are objective, impartial, and free of personal bias.
- Be efficient, flexible and innovative.

In selecting candidates for suitable roles using interviews, Transnet utilises competency-based behavioural interviews. The creation of competency based behavioural interview questions is currently and centrally managed and is compiled manually by the resources within Transnet's Group Assessment Centre. They should ensure that these interview guides are created as and when there is an interview request. The same is expected of the hiring manager to develop technical questions to assess functional competencies for each position they interview for.

The process of manually creating unique interview questions per position across various levels of complexity is time consuming and pose potential risks around the degree of consistency and fairness of the interview questions. It should be taken into account that most of the team members creating these interview guides have not received any training.

In addition to interviews, Transnet uses psychometrics assessments to support the business in making informed people management decisions around the recruitment and development of talent. Psychometrics and Competency-based assessments can assist in identifying the candidates', strengths, and areas of development during selection and development processes.

Psychometrics assessments offer scientific credibility and objectivity to the process of selecting and developing employees. Psychometrics assessments provide a fair and accurate way of assessing individuals and teams assessed using standardized, reliable, and valid assessment tools.

To achieve the purpose of the selection processes, the assessment centre uses **a variety of assessment tools fit for the purpose.** These assessments need to align with the Transnet Competency-based and Assessment Frameworks and provide guidance in selecting and using appropriate assessment tools. 2. EXECUTIVE OVERVIEW

Transnet is calling for proposals from experienced service providers who have both the capacity (including national footprint) and capability to offer the most cost-effective, HPCSA approved psychometric and competency-based assessments; as well as competency-based interview guides/questions digital platform aligned to the Transnet Competency and Assessment Frameworks.

3.2 COMPETENCY-BASED INTERVIEW QUESTIONS LIBRARY / INTERVIEW GUIDES ALIGNED TO TRANSNET COMPETENCY FRAMEWORK AND ACCESSIBLE DIGITALLY.



6.6. STEP SIX: Post Tender Negotiations

- 6. The Respondent may further request that Transnet correct (excluding critical/mandatory or evaluation information), delete, destroy, withdraw consent or object to the processing of any personal information relating to the Respondent in Transnet's possession in terms of the provision of the POPIA and utilizing Form 2 of the POPIA Regulations.
- 11. In submitting any information or documentation requested in this RFP, the Respondent is hereby consenting to the processing of their personal information for the purpose of this RFP and further confirming that they are aware of their rights in terms of Section 5 of POPIA
