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5. SCOPE OF WORK

Purchase, collection and removal of ferrous metal scrap (steel, subgrade steel, heavy steel, contaminated / mixed steel scrap OCS's, subgrade, CT's, VT's, steel cages, porcelain, rubber, insulators, transformer boxes, isolators, line hardware, etc) at Eskom Distribution Gauteng Operating Unit (GOU) on an "as and when" required basis.

The successful contractors will be required to comply with the below contract obligation.

- The contract will be valid for twenty-four (24) months duration, although this is contractual and fixed, the contractor will be required to report to the maintenance supervisor/manager and produce a work plan/schedule to service the Eskom Distribution Gauteng.
- The successful contractor will be required to take all removable ferrous metal scrap and have
 it weighed at the weighbridge provided on site, submit weighbridge slip to site
 supervisor/manager and subsequently email it to the Investment Recovery Officer together
 with the proof of payment.
- The successful tendered will be required to collect scrap material as and when required by notification from the Asset Disposal Officer.
- The successful tenderer will be required to weigh the truck empty and once loaded weigh the truck full.
- Eskom's requirement is that with each collection request, a site representative / the end-user / security personnel where the material is to be collected, must accompany the successful tenderer to the nearest weigh bridge (usually +- 20 km radius) to witness the weighing of the scrap and return the individual to the collection site and thereafter email a copy of the weigh bridge ticket to the Asset Disposal Officer.
- All aluminium/copper conductor or aluminium/copper conductor off cuts whether on any salvageable item or not shall remain the property of Eskom at all times. Where the bulk of the material may have to be reworked, stripped or processed away from Eskom premises, then the aluminium/copper conductor and off cuts must be returned to Eskom. This material does not form part of the sale will need to be sorted and separated and remains Eskom property.
- The successful tenderer is required to have sufficient capacity, be in good financial standing and other have the required resources to service this contract at any given point dependent on Eskom's operations.
- The successful tenders is required to place skips / bins at various sites as and when required
- The successful tenderer is accountable to clean the site once the collections is completed and ensure the area is cleaned should there be an oil spill, or any other debris left behind.
- The successful tenderer is to collect all scrap ferrous metal material from site and there will be no sorting or choosing scrap, as per site agent collect and maintain a clean site
- Only tenders that comply with the above conditions can submit their responses.

The purchaser must assure the site be left clean at completion of their collection and removal of the goods.

The purchaser will be responsible for the safe collection, handling, removal, loading and transportation of the ferrous metal scrap as well as to clean the site, qualified labour and suitable certified plant, machinery, equipment and transport for this purpose.

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Payment will be required by the contractor monthly (weighbridge certificates, gate removal permits and reconciliations must be submitted to the Disposal Officer for review and verification every Monday for the duration of the contract. Once reviewed and approved by the Disposal Officer, payment need to be made within 5 days. If payment is not received, no further collection, handling, removal, loading will take place. Further, should payment not be made, the contractor will be refused entry to Eskom Distribution Gauteng sites and a Non-Conformance Report (NCR) will be raised. Failure to correct the situation within a reasonable time will result in the termination of this contract.

The release of the equipment/scrap to the new buyer will take place after receipt of payment to Eskom and the buyer acquiring a permit to remove and transport the equipment/scrap.

The goods on sale will be identified by Eskom.

A safety file needs to be approved before commencement of any work from Eskom.

NOTES

- a. Eskom will not be responsible for any damages or losses suffered during the removal of the equipment incurred while working on this project arising from theft, damage, or personal injury.
- b. You will be required to adhere to the condition as laid out by the Eskom site agent with regards to site access etc.
- c. Littering is prohibited at all times. Facilities will have to be made available on site during dismantling operations for the collection of disposal waste material. No rubble whatsoever is to be left on site.
- d. Additional precautions must be taken when using cutting equipment. Portable firefighting equipment must be available on site during all stages of the work programme.
- e. You will be required to be put on an Eskom permit, prior to commencement of and work. After completion of the work, it is imperative that you notify the Eskom site agent, so that the job can be signed off.
- f. All work must comply with the OHSA Act no 85 of 1993. All Safety requirements and documentation shall be available on the site.
- g This is an open tender
- h. No accommodation will be allowed on site.
- i. Eskom will not be responsible for any damages or losses suffered during the removal of equipment/scrap incurred while working on this project arising from theft, damage or personal injury.
- j. You will be required to adhere to the condition as laid out by the Eskom site agent with regards to site access etc.
