APPOINTMENT OF A CONSTRUCTION HEALTH AND SAFETY AGENT FOR THE OLIEWENHUIS ROOF REFURBISHMENT PROJECT FOR A PERIOD OF FOUR (4) MONTHS

1. Background to the National Museum

The National Museum - a natural history, cultural history and art museum was established in 1877 and is a declared cultural institution, which resorts under the Department of Arts and Culture and is governed by a council. The mission of the National Museum is to provide heritage resources and an enjoyable experience to all people through quality research, conservation, education and exhibitions. 2. Purpose and Background

The National Museum has appointed a contractor for the refurbishment of Oliewenhuis Art Museum roof, and the Museum would like to appoint a suitable and qualified Construction OHS Agent for the refurbishment of this roof.

3. Scope/Specifications with deliverables of Service(s) required.

3.1.1 PERSONNEL EXPERIENCE

- Minimum of 5 years' occupational health and safety work experience in a construction environment.
- Experience as an appointed Health and Safety Agent/Manager for compliance with legislation performing tasks such as preparing, reviewing, assessing and auditing of health and safety specification on projects with a value from R500, 000.00 upwards.
- Experience as an appointed Health and Safety Agent/Manager for compliance with legislation performing tasks such as preparing, reviewing, assessing and auditing of health and safety specification in subsurface pipeline construction projects.
- Experience as an appointed Health and Safety Agent/Manager for compliance with legislation performing tasks such as preparing, reviewing, assessing and auditing of health and safety specification on construction projects or similar high structure project.

3.1.2 REGISTRATION AS A CONSTRUCTION HEALTH AND SAFETY AGENT WITH THE SOUTH AFRICAN COUNCIL FOR PROJECT AND CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT PROFESSION (SACPCMP)

- The recommended resource must be registered with the South African Council for Project and Construction Management Profession (SACPCMP) as a Construction Health and Safety Agent.
- Suppliers submitted by registered entities are based on the services of specified key resource. Should the individual(s) leave the services of the entity, it is the responsibility of the entity to propose the individual with equal or better credentials than the individual leaving the entity

3.1.3 PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The refurbishment of the Oliewenhuis Art Museum project is intended to repair the roof of a classified heritage building which is focusing **ONLY** on the roof.

The project scope include the following:

Loose slate roof tiles to be replaced

- Underlying waterproofing membrane to be inspected and repaired
- All valleys and ridges to be inspected and repaired
- Wooden support battens to be inspected for rot and replaced/repared
- All Sheet metal gutters and -downpipes to all be removed and replaced
- Existing asbestos sewer vent-pipes protruding through the roof to be removed

3.1.4 SCOPE OF WORK

Detailed Description of Goods/Services

Appoint a Construction Health and Safety Agent (CHSA) who will:

- Prepare Project Baseline Risk Assessment.

- Prepare Health and Safety Specification.
- Assist with design risk review and report hazards associated with the designs.
- Review of Principal Contractor tender submissions, competencies and resources.
- Prepare Health and Safety Regulations and ensure that the contractor appointed has the necessary competencies and resources to carry out the construction work safely.
- Review of Contractor Health and Safety Management Plans and Health and Safety Files.
- Attend project meetings.
- Carry out investigations into significant incidents.
- Carry out monthly health and safety audits.
- Ensure that a copy of the health and safety audit report is provided to the contractor within seven (7) days after the audit.
- Ensure that the health and safety file/record is kept and maintained by the contractor.
- Stop the contractor from executing a construction activity which poses a threat to persons and/or not in line with the Client OHS specification and Contractor's OHS plan.

3.1.5 Deliverables

- Project Baseline Risk Assessment.
- Site specific Health and Safety Specification.
- Design risk report and hazards associated with the site.
- Submit Construction Work Permit Application and all supporting documentation to the Department of Labour IF NECESSARY.
- Approved Principal Contractor tender submissions, competencies and resources.
- Approved Principal Contractor Health and Safety Management Plans and Health and Safety Files.
- Attend project meetings.
- Reports of significant incidents investigations.
- Reports of monthly health and safety audits.

3.1.6 STAGE 1: ELIGIBILITY

- Only those bidders who satisfy the following criteria are eligible to submit bid:
- Submit an RFQ only if the bidder (whether a single company or a structure similar to a Joint Venture) or any of his principals, is not listed on the National Treasury Restricted and Defaulters Report under any restriction to do business with /State Owned Companies.
- Registered on National Treasury Central Supplier Database.

Bidder, or in the event of a Joint Venture (JV), each member of the JV, shall be registered on the National Treasury Central Supplier Database.

- The recommended resource must be registered with the South African Council for Project and Construction Management Profession (SACPCMP) as a Construction Health and Safety Agent.
- Bidders are deemed ineligible to submit a bid if: 5.2.1. Bidders submit more than one bid either individually or as a partner in a joint venture (JV) or consortium.

4 Compulsory requirements

The bidder must adhere to the below compulsory requirements and attach the required documents listed below to the quotation for the bid to be accepted as eligible.

4.4	Technical Proposal detailing how the scope is to be delivered.
4.5	Fully completed and signed, SBD 4 form must be attached.
4.6	The bidder must be registered on CSD and CSD supplier report must be attached.
4.8	The bidder must be tax compliant, and a tax pin issued by SARS must be attached.
4.10	The bidder must complete the price schedule in paragraph 8, below.

5 Minimum requirements

Order	
5.1	A valid copy of BBBEE certificate or completed and signed BBBEE declaration is not compulsory but may be attached to score points on specific goals.
5.2	In case of a legal person, the bidder must be an active company registered in the Republic of South Africa and a copy of CIPS registration documents must be attached.

Matters for noting.

1. Non-compliance to the above compulsory requirements will lead to a disqualification of the service provider, except where non-tax compliant with tax matters which is subject to

grace period of at least 7 days that will be provided to a preferred service provider should that service provider be non-compliant following bid evaluation.

2. Failure by this preferred service provider to rectify its tax matters to a compliant status within the grace period provided will lead to an automatic disqualification.
3. Validity period for bids or formal written quotations submitted shall be valid for a minimum period of sixty (90) days. The formal written price quotations received from the service provider/supplier will be regarded as valid for 90 days despite expiry date which is less than 90 days indicated on a quote.

7 Bid Evaluation.

All bidders will be subject to a three-stage technical evaluation process as follows.

- a. Pre-screening, i.e. determination of compliance to compulsory requirements. They will be required to pass pre-screening to be eligible for further evaluation.
- b. Technical assessment, measurement of capability. The bidder will be required to obtain a minimum of 70 points in order to be eligible for preferential procurement evaluation.
- c. Preferential procurement calculation 80/20, whereby 80 is for price and 20 points for specific goals.

8 Technical Assessment

Only suppliers who meet the threshold of 70% and above of the total functionality/quality points will be eligible to be evaluated further on preferential procurement of 80/20 points.

10 Preferential Procurement

Preferential procurement calculation 80/20, whereby 80 is for price and 20 points for specific goals.

Preference Point System

In accordance with the Preferential Procurement Regulations of 2022, NM has determined the following specific goals for which preference points will be awarded:

Goal 1: Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment

Section 10 of the B-BBEE Act enjoins every public entity to take into account and apply the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice in determining and implementing a preferential procurement policy. NM will thus award preference points to suppliers based on their B-BBEE specific preferential goals.

Goal 2: Empowerment of Local Businesses

NM is in the Free State, a rural province on the margins of economic activity. To develop and empower local businesses based in the Free State, NM will award preference point to suppliers based in the Free State.

Goal 3: Youth Empowerment

Youth participation in the economy is crucial for the growth and development of the South African economy, but their participation has been limited by several factors. One of the main challenges for youth has been the high levels of unemployment. The unemployment rate for young people in South Africa is much higher than the national average, which makes it difficult for them to enter the labour market and participate in the economy.

In an effort to empower youth and encourage their participation in the economy, NM will award preference points to businesses which are at least 51% owned by youth.

Goal 4: Women Empowerment

Women participation in the economy is crucial for the growth and development of the South African economy, but their participation has been limited by several factors. For women, the challenge has been unequal access to economic opportunities, including education, training, and employment. Women in South Africa often face discrimination and gender-based violence, which can limit their ability to participate in the economy. Additionally, women tend to be concentrated in low-paying, informal sector jobs, which offer little security and limited opportunities for advancement.

To empower women and encourage their participation in the economy, NM will award preference points to businesses which are at least 51% owned by women.

Goal 5: Empowerment of People with Disabilities

People with disabilities face significant barriers to participating in the South African economy. According to the World Bank, about seven million South Africans have some form of disability, and they are more likely to experience poverty and unemployment compared to those without disabilities.

People with disabilities often face discrimination in the labour market and have limited access to education, training, and employment opportunities. They may also face physical and attitudinal barriers, making it difficult for them to fully participate in the economy.

In an effort to empower people with disabilities and encourage their participation in the economy, NM will award preference points to businesses which are at least 51% owned by people with disabilities.
