TERMS OF REFERENCE

1. PURPOSE OF THE SPECIFICATION

- 1.1. Khula Business Premises (Pty) Ltd (KBP) a wholly owned subsidiary of the Small Enterprise Finance Agency (sefa) wishes to appoint a Professional Electrical Contracting Service Provider who is registered with relevant authorities to provide the above service at its property as indicated below. The bidder shall comply with all relevant government legislation as well as comply with sefa's terms and conditions.
- 1.2. Bidders are invited to submit RFQs for Electrical installation at Gelvendale Facturama, 3 Liebenberg Road, Gelvendale, Gqebertha, Eastern Cape.

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1. Following a Cabinet decision and the State of the Nation address of 2011, the Small Enterprise Finance Agency (SOC) Limited (sefa), was established on 01 April 2012 in terms of section 3 (d) of the Industrial Development Corporation Act, No. 22 of 1940 (IDC Act). sefa is a wholly owned subsidiary of the Industrial Development Corporation (IDC) and brings together the activities of the three previous structures (Khula, samaf and the IDC small business activities).
- 2.2. sefa operates as a Development Finance Institution (DFI) to foster the establishment, development, and growth of Small, Micro and Medium Enterprises (SMMEs) and contributes toward poverty alleviation, job creation and economic growth. sefa provides products and services to qualifying SMMEs as defined in the National Small Business Act of 1996, as amended in 2004, through a hybrid of wholesale and direct lending channels.

3. SCOPE OF WORK

- 3.1. The services required are for properties situated in the following locations: Johannesburg, Pretoria, and Ekurhuleni.
- 3.2. Electricity in the properties is supplied by Eskom and the respective municipalities where the properties are located.
- 3.3. The service provider is required to conduct an intensive technical assessment of the properties' electrical reticulation to determine the compatibility of the smart prepaid electrical system where applicable.
- 3.4. The service provider should advise or recommend the appropriate prepaid meters and metering equipment that can be installed to enable compatibility.
- 3.5. The service provider will be required to assess usage and establish/or advise if the correct tarrifs are charged.
- 3.6. The service provider is expected to submit a comprehensive assessment report including the specifications of the material and compatible smart prepaid meters on a BOQ format.

5. EVALUATION CRITERIA

- 5.1. This RFQ will be evaluated in three (3) stages as follows:
 - Stage 1- Administrative Compliance Requirements (Initial Screening Process)
 - Stage 2 Mandatory Requirements
 - Stage 3 Price and Preference (Specific Goals).

5.2. Stage 1 - Administrative Compliance

- a) The Standard Bid Document (SBD 4 & 6.1) forms must be fully completed and signed by the authorized company representative.
 - The bidder must submit proof of registration on CSD (Central Supplier Database) in the form of CSD Report.
- b) Submission of valid Tax Compliance Status (TCS) Certificate with a unique security personal, Identification (PIN) issued by the South African Revenue Services certifying that the taxes of the bidder are in the order must be submitted at the closing date and time of the RFQ.
- (d) The bidder must submit a certified valid B-BBEE certificate; in the event of submission of a B-BBEE Sworn Affidavit, the bidder must ensure that the Affidavit is stamped by the Commissioner of Oath and indicate the ownership percentages and or specific goals of the Bidding entity;



(e) The bidder must submit Companies & Intellectual Property Commission (CIPC) company registration documents listing all Directors or Shareholders and certified ID copies for directors/shareholders/members/partners.

Note:

- If the bidder is listed on the National Treasury List of Restricted Suppliers shall result in disqualification of the bid
- If any of its Directors are Listed on the Register of Defaulters shall result in disqualification of the bid.
- If the status of the bidder is reflecting deregistered on CIPC and or CSD shall result in disqualification of the bid.

Note: All bidders who do not comply with the items listed above may be disqualified and not be evaluated further.

5.3. Stage 2: Mandatory Requirements Evaluation

Bidders who fail to comply with all the mandatory requirements will not be considered for further evaluation, and they will be automatically disqualified.

5.4. Stage 3: Price and Specific Goals

5.4.1. This RFQ will be evaluated based on price and specific goals in line with the provisions of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act 5 of 2000, Regulation 2022. As the RFQ price is estimated to be less than R 50 00 000.00, RFQ responses will be evaluated on the 80/20 price & and specific goals.
