3. RESPONSE FORMAT

Suppliers shall submit the response in accordance with the response format specified below; failure to do so may result in a disqualification of bidder's response.

3.1 Mandatory documents

Original and valid tax clearance certificate (no certified or scanned copy will be accepted) must be submitted. If a bidder responds as a Consortium or Joint Venture. Original and valid Tax Clearance Certificate must be submitted for each member. The following schedules must be included in the response to quote.

Schedule 1: Executive Summary

The executive summary must cover the following:

- Paragraph 1 The Bidder needs to indicate to us that he is responding as a Prime contractor, joint venture, consortium or partnership and list the parties concerned
- Paragraph 2 The Bidder needs to inform us that as the executive committee of the company we have duly designated the following employee name and surname to act on our behalf for the consortium, joint venture, partnership or Prime contractor.
- Paragraph 3 The Bidder markets themselves by informing us that they have done similar work for other companies and must provide us with contact details as references.
- Paragraph 4 The Bidder gives us a short summary or clarification of their response.

4. ICASA'S TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF REQUEST FOR QUOTATION (RFQ)

- 1. ICASA's conditions of purchase shall apply.
- 2. No services must be rendered or goods delivered before an official ICASA Purchase Order form has been received and the service level agreement is signed.
- 3. Late and incomplete submissions will not be accepted.
- 4. The tax clearance must be submitted as requested.
- 5. Responses to this RFQ must be submitted in a sealed envelope, clearly marked with the description and number of the RFQ.
- 6. All invoices must be submitted to the Procurement.

5. TAX CLEARANCE REQUIREMENTS

a) Bidders are required to submit an original Tax Clearance Certificate for all price quotations exceeding the value of R30 000 (VAT included).

- b) Failure to submit an original and valid Tax Clearance Certificate will result in the disqualification of your response this RFQ.
- c) A certified copy of the Tax Clearance Certificate will not be accepted.
- d) It is the responsibility of the bidder to ensure that ICASA is in possession of the bidder's valid Tax Clearance certificate. It is therefore not necessary to submit a tax clearance certificate if the bidder has submitted a tax clearance for any RFQ/B before at ICASA unless ICASA requires it. The onus is on the bidder to ensure that ICASA receives a valid Tax Clearance Certificate as soon as the validity of the said certificate expires.
- f) Bidders are required to complete Annexure B for all price quotations exceeding the value of R30 000 (VAT included).

6. EVALUATION CRITERIA

This RFQ will be evaluated in terms of the 80/20 preference point system prescribed by the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2001. The allocation of points will be as follows:

7. PRICING REQUIREMENTS FOR QUOTATIONS.

All prices must be quoted in South African Rand (ZAR) and the foreign currency amount applicable must be stated.

- a) The Supplier must indicate **clearly** which portion of the quoted price is linked to the exchange rate.
- b) The cost of delivery and other charges must be included in the total price quoted.
- c) Please note that ICASA will require the successful bidder to obtain forward cover equal to this amount immediately upon receipt of a letter of acceptance, or an official purchase order.
- d) After ICASA Procurement has received proof from the bidders banker of the forward cover rate, an amendment to the purchase order will be processed which would reflect firm pricing.

8. REASONS FOR DISQUALIFICATION

ICASA reserves the right to disqualify any bidder which does any one or more of the following,

- a. Suppliers who do not submit a valid and original Tax Clearance Certificate on the closing date and time of the bid;
- b. Suppliers who submitted incomplete information and documentation according to the requirements of this RFQ;
- c. Suppliers who submitted information that is fraudulent, factually untrue or inaccurate, for example memberships that do not exist, BEE credentials, experience, etc.;

- d. Supplier who received information not available to other vendors through fraudulent means; and/or
- e. Suppliers who do not comply with any other *requirements* as stipulated in this RFQ document.
- f. Suppliers who do not comply with the mandatory functional requirements
- g. Suppliers who fail to sign their RFQ response or does not complete SBD 6.1
- h. ICASA reserves the right to; cancel or reject any quote and not to award the RFQ to the lowest bidder or award parts of the RFQ to different bidders, or not to award the RFQ at all.

1. GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1.1 The following preference point systems are applicable to all bids:
 - the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R1 000 000 (all applicable taxes included); and
 - the 90/10 system for requirements with a Rand value above R1 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).
- 1.2 The value of this bid is estimated to exceed/not exceed R1 000 000 (all applicable taxes included) and therefore the.......system shall be applicable.
- 1.3 Preference points for this bid shall be awarded for:
 - (a) Price; and
 - (b) B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution.
- 1.3.1 The maximum points for this bid are allocated as follows:

- Failure on the part of a bidder to fill in and/or to sign this form and submit a B-BBEE Verification Certificate from a Verification Agency accredited by the South African Accreditation System (SANAS) or a Registered Auditor approved by the Independent Regulatory Board of Auditors (IRBA) or an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the Close Corporation Act (CCA) together with the bid, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for B-BBEE status level of contribution are not claimed.
- 1.5. The purchaser reserves the right to require of a bidder, either before a bid is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the purchaser.

2. **DEFINITIONS**

2..1 "all applicable taxes" includes value-added tax, pay as you earn, income tax, unemployment insurance

fund contributions and skills development levies;

2.2 **"B-BBEE"** means broad-based black economic empowerment as defined in section 1 of the Broad

-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;

2.3 "B-BBEE status level of contributor" means the B-BBEE status received by a measured entity based

on its overall performance using the relevant scorecard contained in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic

Empowerment Act:

- 2.4 "bid" means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by an organ of state for the provision of services, works or goods, through price quotations, advertised competitive bidding processes or proposals;
- 2.5 **"Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act"** means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);
- 2.6 "comparative price" means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts that can be utilized have been taken into consideration:
- 2.7 "consortium or joint venture" means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their

expertise, property, capital, efforts, skill and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract;

- 2.8 "contract" means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by an organ of state;
- 2.9 "EME" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R5 million or less .
- 2.10 "Firm price" means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs or excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- 2.11 **"functionality"** means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid

documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a

service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;

- 2.12 "non-firm prices" means all prices other than "firm" prices;
- 2.13 "person" includes a juristic person;
- 2.14 **"rand value"** means the total estimated value of a contract in South African currency, calculated at

the time of bid invitations, and includes all applicable taxes and excise duties;

- 2.15 "sub-contract" means the primary contractor's assigning, leasing, making out work to, or employing, another person to support such primary contractor in the execution of part of a project in terms of the contract;
- 2.16 **"total revenue"** bears the same meaning assigned to this expression in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based

Black Economic Empowerment Act and promulgated in the *Government Gazette* on 9 February 2007:

- 2.17 "**trust**" means the arrangement through which the property of one person is made over or bequeathed to a trustee to administer such property for the benefit of another person; and
- 2.18 "**trustee**" means any person, including the founder of a trust, to whom property is bequeathed in order for such property to be administered for the benefit of another person.

3. ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

- 3.1 The bidder obtaining the highest number of total points will be awarded the contract.
- 3.2 Preference points shall be calculated after prices have been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices and all unconditional discounts;.
- 3.3 Points scored must be rounded off to the nearest 2 decimal places.
- In the event that two or more bids have scored equal total points, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.
- 3.5 However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- 3.6 Should two or more bids be equal in all respects, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

4.1 THE 80/20 OR 90/10 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS

A maximum of 80 or 90 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

80/20 or 90/10

Ps = Points scored for comparative price of bid under consideration

Pt = Comparative price of bid under consideration

5. POINTS AWARDED FOR B-BBEE STATUS LEVEL OF CONTRIBUTION

5.1 In terms of Regulation 5 (2) and 6 (2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded to a bidder for attaining the B-BBEE status level of contribution in accordance with the table below:

- 5.2 Bidders who qualify as EMEs in terms of the B-BBEE Act must submit a certificate issued by an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the CCA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS or a Registered Auditor. Registered auditors do not need to meet the prerequisite for IRBA's approval for the purpose of conducting verification and issuing EMEs with B-BBEE Status Level Certificates.
- 5.3 Bidders other than EMEs must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS.
- 5.4 A trust, consortium or joint venture, will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as a legal entity,

provided that the entity submits their B-BBEE status level certificate.

5.5 A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated

entity, provided that the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were a group

structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.

- 5.6 Tertiary institutions and public entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialized scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.
- 5.7 A person will not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level if it is indicated in the bid documents that

such a bidder intends sub-contracting more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise

that does not qualify for at least the points that such a bidder qualifies for, unless the intended sub-

contractor is an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the sub-contract.

5.8 A person awarded a contract may not sub-contract more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other

enterprise that does not have an equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the

contract is sub-contracted to an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the sub-contract.
