1.6 RFQ Responses

SECTION 2: BACKGROUND, PURPOSE AND SCOPE OF WORK

1.1. Scope of Work

Objective of this Tender

The objective is to maintain the serviceability of the infrastructure at the Aviation park at OR Tambo International Airport in a sustainable manner at the lowest operating and maintenance costs while ensuring compliance to general safety, environment, ICAO and all other aviation related legislation. The Contractor will be responsible for the once-off remedial landscaping maintenance of the gardens at Aviation park at OR Tambo International Airport.

The maintenance and control of landscaped areas are crucial in assisting with the control of weeds and alien vegetation. The aim is to establish healthy, thriving plants, encourage strong growth and allow for aesthetically pleasing plant landscapes. The maintenance of the landscaping plays a major role in the upkeep of the airport precinct, ensuring that a high security level within the airport precinct is maintained to allow a clear line of sight at fences, buildings, whilst also acting as firebreaks.

To provide facilities which are clean and hygienic, attempt to meet with the minimum requirements of the Occupational Health and Safety Act and those of airport users and stakeholders when using the airport. This contract is also intended to assist ACSA to meet the expectations of Airport Service Quality (ASQ) standards as per the Key Performance Indicator (KPI) set by the ACSA Board from time to time.

The scope of this contract will include:

DESCRIPTION OF THE WORKS

Employer's objectives

The objective is to maintain the serviceability of the Signage at OR Tambo International Airport in a sustainable manner at the lowest operating and maintenance costs while ensuring compliance to general safety and aviation related legislation.

The Contractor will maintain all Signage of the OR Tambo International Airport_and at Aviation Park (Western Precinct) The specifications and requirements in this document comprise the description of the Works. The Contractor will be appointed directly by the Airports Company of South Africa.

Overview of the works

In brief, the Contractor will be responsible for maintaining all Terminal buildings signage,

Parking signage and Airside Apron signage at OR Tambo International Airport as and when required.

Cleaning all light boxes Terminal A & B, MSP 1 & 2, Basement parking, Carports and shaded parking as well as long term parking and Airside and Cargo, this will be at ACSA's discretion in terms of budget availability

Cleaning of overheads road signs

Design, Manufacture, Maintenance and repair of all signs illuminated and non-illuminated in all areas

Maintenance of signs on airside excluding the manoeuvring areas covered by Electrical Department

Reporting daily on IMC call list feedback

Inspection of all signs specified above, and any maintenance requirements reported to the service manager

Extent of the work

The Contractor will be fully responsible for meeting all requirements in this document regarding the Works.

The Contractor will be responsible for providing staff which are sufficiently skilled and qualified for successful execution of the works. This may be amended by mutual arrangement between ACSA and the Contractor.

The Contractor shall always remain responsible to ensure that the on-site staff compliment and maintenance regime is sufficient to maintain the service levels and system performance. Should the Contractor not be able to maintain adequate system performance due to constraints caused by the Employer, it shall be timeously reported, in writing, to the Contract Manager.

The Contractor will ensure that his/her staff compliment is of a sufficient quantity to allow for uninterrupted supply of labour in the event of his/her staff taking sick leave, paid leave and will allow for all staff related eventualities.

The Contractor shall continuously ensure that all staff is suitable, able and competent for the duties required of them. The Contractor shall continuously ensure that all staff is knowledgeable and trustworthy of the signage systems activities/procedures in the area. The Contractor shall further ensure that any staff member reasonably suspected of partaking in criminal activities is immediately removed from site and his permit returned and/or cancelled at the ACSA Permit Office.

All work shall be performed within the required Response Times Any breakdown impacting on operations shall be attended-to until restored to good reliable condition. No breakdown may be left unattended or incomplete for the next day or shift. All repair work shall carry a defect free guaranteed for a period of 6 months after completion of work.

All spares will be charged according to the Activity Schedule. ACSA shall provide an on-site spares room to the contractor free of charge. The Contractor shall keep the spares room in a neat and clean state and an updated spares list will always be available on-site and submitted to the Service Manager at the end of every month. Spares will be neatly arranged and easily locatable via an appropriate index on the spares list. Wherever practicable, a notice will be placed on the rack, next to the spare part, as to where the part is used in the installation.

The Contractor will be responsible for holding all tools and/or special equipment that might be required for the execution of the works, either on site or on their premises in order to comply with the Response Time requirements of this contract. Any exclusion to the above should be clearly communicated in the returnable schedules when submitting the tender.

The Contractor shall ensure that, unless a special arrangement is made with the Service Manager, all senior staff members and on-site support staff is always immediately reachable via cell phone.

The Contractor shall ensure that all maintenance staff are issued with uniforms that will comply with a minimum requirement as agreed with the Service Manager from time to time. Current airport requirements are safety shoes, ear protection equipment and a uniquely numbered retro reflective jacket (for easy identification via CCTV).

Location of the works

The Works are located at OR Tambo International Airport at the airside. It is crucial for the Contractor to note that OR Tambo International Airport is a National Key Point and governed as such.

2. SECTION 3: EVALUATION CRITERIA

2.1. Evaluation Stages

AIRPORTS COMPANY SOUTH AFRICA will use pre-determined evaluation stages when considering received quotations. The evaluation criteria will consider the commitment made for functionality/technical, Price and BEE, Objective Criteria

During the evaluation of received quotation packs AIRPORTS COMPANY SOUTH AFRICA will make an assessment whether all the bids comply with set minimum requirements and whether all returnable documents/information have been submitted. Bidders which fail to meet minimum requirements, thresholds or have not submitted required mandatory documents may be disqualified from the RFQ process.

The requirements of any given stage must be complied with prior to progression to the next stage. AIRPORTS COMPANY SOUTH AFRICA reserves the right to disqualify bidders without requesting any outstanding document/information.

2.2. Mandatory Requirements Assessment

2.4. Functionality Evaluation Criteria

The functional / technical evaluation will be based on a threshold, where bidders which fail to achieve the overall minimum of **60 points**, as well as failing to achieve the **minimum number of points of the functional / technical evaluation sub-criteria** on the functional stage shall not be considered further in the evaluation. The thresholds on each element of the evaluation are as follows.

Functionality Evaluation Criteria

The obligation to demonstrate compliance with all of the above will remain with the Tenderer and ACSA's decision in this regard will be final.

<u>Technical Functionality to be met by suppliers before submitting the Quotation:</u>

- •The successful contactor must have at least 3 to 5 years proven experience in the signage design, manufacturing and installation industry, with contactable client references of where they have done work before.
- •Contractors need to have a manufacturing plant with sufficient equipment where they will be able to do all the design and manufacturing of signs work and deliver at stipulated time frame (4 weeks). •Contractor must have an LDV bakkie that is not older than 5 years in order to be able to pass the safety test and access the airside to execute the works.
- Contractor must have minimum of 6m aluminium ladder and all required hand tools to execute the work (skyjack licence is a must as certain size are higher than 6m and Acsa provide the equipment but not driver).
- All works shall carry a defect free guarantee for 6 months after completion of work.
- A Site Manager is required to be immediately reachable via cell phone.
- •Contractor to ensure staff have the relevant PPE including Acsa safety requirements like: safety shoes, ear protection and a uniquely numbered retro reflective jacket (for easy identification on cctv camera).

The require response time for call out normal hours and normal work 6 hours. The required response time for a call out on urgent work 4 hours. All planned work allocated should completed with the agreed times.

- •Contractor to make allowance of all Acsa required permits needed in order to execute the works in their pricing, they cannot want to recover that cost from Acsa once on site. The permits costs will include airside induction for each staff member at a cost.
- •Selected contractor to be screened for criminal checks by Acsa permit office before being appointed / given PO (Note: The contractor will have no claim against Acsa (within reason) if a permit request is refused).

2.5. Price and BBEE
