1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Request for Quotation (RFQ) is to invite suitable qualified solar energy expert to provide technical advisory services to the National Arts Council of South Africa (NAC).

2. BACKGROUND

The National Arts Council of South Africa, an Agency of the Department of Arts and Culture, is the defacto successor in title to the Foundation for the Creative Arts, originally established in 1989. NACSA's mandate as set out in the National Arts Council Act, Act 56 of 1997, specifies its Objects as:

- To provide, and encourage the provision of, opportunities for persons to practice the arts
- To promote the appreciation, understanding and enjoyment of the arts
- To promote the general application of the arts in the community
- To foster the expression of a national identity and consciousness by means of the arts
- To uphold and promote the right of any person to freedom in the practice of the arts
- To give the historically disadvantaged such additional help and resources as are required to give them greater access to the arts
- To address historical imbalances in providing infrastructure for the promotion of the arts
- To promote and facilitate national and international liaison between individuals

3. SCOPE OF WORK

The National Arts Council of South Africa (NAC) hereby invites service providers from suitably Professional, qualified and experienced solar energy experts to provide technical advisory services to the NAC.

The contract period will be for a two (2) month period. The ideal service provider must be registered with the relevant statutory body, experienced and with sound-track record in rendering technical advise on the solar systems installation.

- 3.1 The scope of work includes and addresses the following:
- 3.1.1 The service provider shall be required to submit a detailed report and assessment of the current solar energy requirements and future energy requirements to power the entire building. The report must entail:
- 3.1.1.1 Assessment of the current solar system and UPS usage
- 3.1.1.2 Solar energy requirements for the building
- 3.1.1.3 Technical information on what solar system(invertor) will be compatible with current solar system installation
- 3.2 The service provider will required to provide advise on the Project Management Services to be undertaken for the Solar installation project. The Project Management Services may include the following activities:
 - Project Planning: This involves defining the project scope, objectives, deliverables, and timelines, as well as identifying the resources and estimated budget required to complete the project.
 - Resource Management: This involves estimating the number of resources required to initiate and complete the project, including people, technology, and other assets.
 - Risk Management: This involves identifying, assessing, and managing risks that may impact
 the project, and implementing strategies to mitigate those risks.
 - Quality Management: This involves ensuring that the project meets the required quality standards, through activities such as testing, quality assurance, and quality control.

- Overall, Solar Project Management Services are critical for the successful delivery of NAC Solar project, as they ensure that projects are completed on time, within budget, and to the required quality standards. This will also include regular reporting to NAC Management.
- 3.3 The service provider will be required to conduct a risk and safety assessment of the building including any other additional information about the appropriate solar system which will be compatible with the building.
- 3.4 The current solar system installed at the NAC consists fo the following:
 - A 10kva solar system was installed in the building to provide power to dedicated circuits.
 - 2 X 5kva Luxpower inverters which were installed in parallel to make it a 10Kva system.
 - 2 X 5.5 kwh hubble batteries
 - 12 X 600W/660W Solar Panels

1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

2. **DEFINITIONS**

- (a) "tender" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) "price" means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) "tender for income-generating contracts" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and

- (d) recommend that the tenderer or contractor, its shareholders and directors, or only the shareholders and directors who acted on a fraudulent basis, be restricted from obtaining business from any organ of state for a period not exceeding 10 years, after the *audi alteram partem* (hear the other side) rule has been applied; and
- (e) forward the matter for criminal prosecution, if deemed necessary
