1. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

This Request for Proposal (RFP) has been compiled by the CSOS and is made available to Bidders subject to the following terms and conditions, which Bidders are deemed to acknowledge and accept:

- 1.1. A Quotation submitted in response to this RFP will constitute a binding offer that will remain binding and irrevocable for a period of one hundred and twenty (90) days from the date of submission to the CSOS.
- 1.2. Unless or until a binding contract is concluded between the CSOS and the successful Bidder, the offer constituted by the quotation will be deemed not to have been accepted and no agreement will be deemed to be reached with any Bidder.
- 1.3. The CSOS reserves the right to amend, modify, withdraw or terminate this RFP or any of the requirements set out herein at any time (and from time to time), without prior notice and without liability to compensate or reimburse any Bidder or person.
- 1.4. Should this RFP be amended, the CSOS undertakes to publicize or send each Bidder in writing the amended RFP. No oral amendments by the Bidder or the CSOS shall be considered.
- 1.5. It is compulsory for a Bidder submitting a quotation to be registered on the National Treasury's Central Supplier Database ("the CSD") and ensure that it remains registered for the duration of the services and/or contract, if successful.
- 1.6. The Bidder needs to ensure that it is tax compliant at the time of submitting its quotation and remains tax compliant for the duration of the contract and/or services, if successful, and undertakes to provide supporting documentation issued by the South African Revenue Services ("SARS") confirming it is tax compliant upon request by the CSOS.
- 1.7. The CSOS reserves the right to conduct site inspections or call for supporting documentation to confirm any information provided by a Bidder in its response to this quotation.
- 1.8. This RFP is not intended to form the basis of a decision to enter into any transaction with the CSOS and does not constitute an offer or recommendation to enter into such transaction, or an intention to enter into any legal relationship with any person.

- 1.9. Neither the CSOS nor any of its respective directors, officers, employees, agents, representatives, or advisors will assume any responsibility for any costs or expenses incurred by any party in or associated with preparing or submitting a quotation in response to this RFP.
- 1.10. No entity or associated entities may be directly or indirectly involved in more than one quotation in response to this RFP. Failure to comply with this requirement may, within the sole discretion of the CSOS, result in disgualification of both entities.
- 1.11. Any material changes in the control and/or composition of any Bidder or any core member of a Bidder after submission of a quotation must be brought to the attention of the CSOS Supply Chain Management ("SCM") Section in writing. The CSOS shall be the sole arbiter as to what constitutes a material change in the control and/or composition of any Bidder and may in its sole discretion disqualify the Bidder from any further participation in the bid process.
- 1.12. Any requirement set out in this RFP which stipulates the form and/or content of any aspect of a quotation is stipulated for the sole benefit of the CSOS, and unless the contrary is expressed, may be waived by the CSOS in its sole discretion at any stage in the bid process.
- 1.13. The CSOS and its advisors shall rely on a quotation as being accurate and complete about the information and proposals provided therein by the Bidders.
- 1.14. All quotations submitted to CSOS shall become the property of the CSOS and will not be returned to the Bidders. The CSOS will make all reasonable efforts to maintain the information contained in proposals confidentially.
- 1.15. A quotation submitted by the Bidder shall be considered non-responsive if it shows any omissions or irregularities of any kind. However, the CSOS reserves the right to waive any aspect of non-responsiveness and to make an award in the best interest of the organization provided that any such waiver shall be applied consistently across all Bidders.
- 1.16. The CSOS reserves the right to accept or reject in part or whole any submitted quotation submitted.
- 1.17. The CSOS reserves the right to require a Bidder to provide a formal presentation of its RFP at a date and time to be determined by the CSOS. The CSOS shall provide adequate instructions and clarification regarding the purpose and scope of the presentation. All expenses shall be borne by the Bidder.

- 1.18. In this RFP, the words "service provider", and "supplier" will be used interchangeably to refer to the Bidder.
- 1.19. All costs associated with the preparation and submission of the quotation remain the responsibility of the Bidder. The costs shall not be chargeable to the CSOS by the successful or unsuccessful Bidder.
- 1.20. All quotations must be formulated and submitted according to the requirements of this RFP.
- 1.21. Quotations received after the closing date and time as specified in this RFP shall be rejected.
- 1.22. The CSOS is not obliged to appoint a bidder with the lowest price, if, based on its sole discretion and assessment, the said bidder does not exhibit or demonstrate adequate capacity or full comprehension of the scope of work to be undertaken.
- 1.23. In this regard, CSOS may appoint the second-ranked bidder provided that the reasons for such deviation are properly justified and accurately recorded.

2. INTRODUCTION

- 2.1. The Community Schemes Ombud Services (CSOS) is established in terms of the Community Schemes Ombud Services Act 2011 (Act 9 of 2011), to regulate the conduct of parties within community schemes and to ensure good governance within community schemes. To deliver on its mandate, among the key priorities of the organisation is:
- 2.1.1. Regulations of all community schemes.
- 2.1.2. Provision of Dispute Resolution Services.
- 2.1.3. Quality assurance and keeping custody of schemes governance documentation.
- 2.1.4. Providing access to schemes governance documentation to the members.
- 2.1.5. Ensuring good governance within community schemes.

3. PROJECT PURPOSE AND BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The purpose of this Bid is to invite suitably qualified and experienced service providers to submit proposals for the provision of office space and onsite parking facilities, under a lease agreement to the CSOS, for 24 months. The lease area must be within the range of 120m2- 150m2.
- 3.2 The CSOS aims to request proposals from service providers to assist in identifying a prime site in Greenacres or Newton Park, in Gqeberha, for the acquisition of its Satellite Office.
- 3.3 The service provider must be qualified in property management or own commercial properties for leasing in Greenacres or Newton Park, in Gqeberha.

4. CSOS OVERVIEW

- 4.1. CURRENT OFFICES
- 4.1.1. **Head Office and Gauteng (GP) Regional Office** located at 8 Bauhinia Street, Berkeley Office Park, Highveld Technopark, Centurion

- 4.1.3. **Kwa-Zulu Natal (KZN) regional office** located at 7th Floor Aquasky Towers, 275 Anton Lembede Street, Durban.
- 4.1.4. **Polokwane satellite office** located at Shop 6B, Standard Bank Square, Hans van Rensburg Street, Polokwane.
- 4.1.5. **George satellite office** located at 14 CJ Langenhoven Road, George
- 4.1.6. **Ballito satellite office** located at the Regency House in Ballito.

- 4.1.8. Rustenburg satellite office located at New Heights, 67 Brink Street, Rustenburg.

5. SCOPE OF WORK

5.1. OFFICE LOCATION

The office space should be Greenacres or Newton Park, in Gqeberha. The office space must be within proximity to public transport services.

5.2. BUILDING FEATURES

5.2.1 The leased floor space size (not the total size of the property) must be within a range of 120-150m². The preferred premises should be easily accessible by public transport (taxis, buses) as well as to people with disabilities. The CSOS requires occupation of the office space facility from 1 June 2024 or as soon as practicable thereafter but not later than the 30th of June 2024.

5.2.2 BATHROOM FACILITIES FOR MALES & FEMALES

The Landlord shall hand over fully functional toilet facilities at an agreed occupation date. Bathrooms are to be refurbished and/or fitted with pans, wash hand basins, automatic hand dryers or towels. The Landlord should install sanitation equipment, toilet roll holders, liquid soap dispensers, and paper dispensers. The toilet facilities must be provided for males and females, as specified below:

- 1 Female toilet,
- 1 Male toilet, and
- 1 for people with disabilities (Male and Female)

5.2.3 PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

Bathroom facilities for people with disabilities (clients and staff) must be provided for, as per National Building Regulations 103 of 1997, SANS 10400. The building shall accommodate people with disabilities and comply with the relevant acts, regulations and municipal by-laws.

- 5.2.4 LEASE PERIOD.
- 5.2.4.1 The lease period shall be for 24 months.
- 5.2.4.2 The lease must be flexible to provide for:
 - a) Expansion

- b) Extension
- c) Termination
- d) First right of refusal

5.2.5 PROPERTY

- 5.2.5.1 The building must be at street level for the front office.
- 5.2.5.2 The building should allow for comfortable entrance/exit to and from the building by staff, clients, and stakeholders The building must make provision for perimeter access control which must be accessible to both staff and stakeholders. Access for people with disabilities must be made available.
- 5.2.5.3 Windows must have blinds or appropriate curtaining or an option to brand them.

5.3. EXTERIOR.

The building must be an existing building (complete built structure), and external signage must be permissible.

5.4. CLIMATE-CONTROLLED AIR-CONDITIONING.

Climate-controlled air-conditioning must be provided in all offices and common areas.

5.5. ELECTRICITY

- 5.5.1 The Installation and design shall comply with all relevant regulations and by-laws.
- 5.5.2 A sufficient power supply is to be provided to increase demand at peak times up to 20% of normal use, and each functional area shall have independent control of lighting while emergency lights shall comply with the National Building Regulations.
- 5.5.3 The building shall have enough lightning protection in line with SANS 62305, which must be provided at the bidder's cost Proof of compliance must be submitted, and the provision of backup electricity in case of power supply outages is compulsory.
- 5.5.4 The proposed building must have a backup generator unit or any electricity backup system that provides enough electricity without disruption to the business.
- 5.5.5 Each office must be equipped with easily accessible and sufficient electrical plugs.

5.6. SECURITY OF THE BUILDING.

- 5.6.1 The building must be secured with internal and external security access control systems as follows:
 - a) The building must be secured.
 - b) Fire detection and fire control system; and
 - c) Emergency assembly area.
 - d) Adequate lighting (floodlights)
 - e) After-hour access to the office is a requirement

5.7. PARKING

5.7.1 Covered Parking for Employees

a) Three (3) Parking bays are required for employees' vehicles at the premises and must be available for exclusive use by the CSOS.

5.7.2 Visitors Parking

- a) Approximately 5 parking bays for the CSOS clients as well as 1 parking bay for people with disabilities.
- b) The parking bays provided shall be made available to the CSOS on a 24-hour basis.
- c) There must be an option available to increase or decrease parking bays as and when required.

5.8. AVAILABILITY

Occupation is to commence on 1 June 2024 or as soon as practicable thereafter but not later than the 30th of June 2024.

5.9. INSURANCE

Structural building insurance is the responsibility of the landlord. The Bidder must provide proof of Public Insurance of a minimum of R10 000 000.

5.10. FIRE PROTECTION & RISK MANAGEMENT

The Fire control, safety and risk management shall be in full compliance with the National Building Regulations, SABS 10400 as amended. It will be required that a complete Automatic Sprinkler Inspection Bureau (ASIB) report be submitted, along with all other information regarding fire protection compliance. Fire extinguishers are to be supplied and accessible in emergency situations. Serviced regularly/yearly basis.

5.11. VERTICAL MOVEMENTS

5.11.1 STAIRS

The building must have stairs/ramps in case of fire if it has more than one floor.

5.11.2 LIFTS

If the building has more than one floor, it must provide lifts to be utilised as passenger lifts and or goods with a minimum payload of 1,000 kg at any given time. The building and lifts must comply with the relevant legislation. The lift must allow accessibility for persons with disabilities (in wheelchairs) and must be regularly maintained by the landlord.
